

Journey of Lisa and Dr. Smith with Aurora




Pre-Diagnosis - Start of Symptoms

Initial Doctor's Visit



Lisa starts to **learn more about her** pain. Because the symptoms are persistent and the app sent her a hint to consider seeing her doctor, she calls Dr.Smith. She jots down a few questions and concerns to discuss on the next visit in Aurora's notes section so she will not forget.





Second Medical Encounter

In Aurora, Dr. Smith **sees an overview of** Lisa's symptoms, her pain level, and the questions and concerns she has. The cyclical pattern of Lisa's pain catches his eye. The app **alerts him** that Lisa's symptoms indicates a **risk for endometriosis**, so it is important to keep it in mind. Dr. Smith checks in with Lisa to see how she's doing and mentions what he saw on the overview. "Tell me more about your symptoms." Lisa goes on describing her pain much clearer than last time, which makes it easier for Dr.Smith to follow her and understand her situation.

Diagnosis

Dr Smith informs Lisa that she likely has endometriosis. He explains what it is and the version inside Aurora to "with diagnosis", which will provide her with additional information. She's a little and **acknowledging her symptoms**.
